

The walk has become an annual event in memory of Kyle Hyland and this year we will walk in memory of Gabe Rucker a middle school student we lost in December 2020




This wonder I duplicated this month by currently rereading the short stories of other fa-




vorite authors. I started with Canadian Nobel laureate, Alice Munro. Such a prolific writer, it has been a frenzy of delight, even dipped into her sole authorship of a novel, *Lives of Girls and Women*. Her stories are irresistible, dark, fantastic plots, populated by ensembles of amazing people.

Another favorite is Anglo-Irish, Cork born, William Trevor who has alas departed us. He was an accidental find. Many a moon ago, a collection of his short stories was left behind by a suitor of one of our daughters. On reading it, we were overwhelmed with enthusiasm. The book was touted by mouth, passed hand by hand, door to door, by mail, until it dissolved into a shred of nonexistence. Needless to say, the suitor who had such impeccable taste was designated a "keeper" and woe if he was ever treated with any distain. Trevor still charms, grasps after all this time, with many more wonderfully crafted, terse, dense, very Irish stories with a universal slant. One never knows who you'll meet or where you are going in his works.

For a potpourri of the contemporary short story, the yearly publication of *The Best American Short Story of the Year* is a must. Each year an editor is invited to read and select from our myriad of magazines what will be in the year's collection. The guest editors are usually quite literary luminaries--John Updike, Anne Tyler, Junot Diaz, Amy Tan, and Tobias Wolf, just to name a few. As a rule, the biggest representation of stories is from the New Yorker. The style, substance varies very widely as each guest editor has his/her take on what is the best. This variety, from year to year, adds greatly to the interest of the selections. *The Best American Short Stories of 2021* has been published and available. Have a good time, delve into one of these collections!!!!!!

Well, its Carquinez Village volunteers, often members themselves, who pick up messages regularly and help direct the calls to the right people or call back themselves. Members may need help in signing up for an event or need to talk about a certain situation regarding their membership or events or services. We also get calls from the public wanting to know about our services or wanting to sign up to be members themselves, or we may get other types of calls.

If you think this is something you would like to do as a volunteer for the village, we are always in need of volunteers, so let us know. It takes a short training and a commitment to responding to calls for a week at a time, approximately once a month, from the comfort of your own home!!

We use the Google Voice App, which is very easy to use, so you never have to reveal your own number to anyone. It really keeps you in touch as to what is going on with the Village at all times.
